Morning Sessions

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| English Literacy Camp | 6-10 year olds | Campers will enjoy storytelling, songs, rhymes, letter and sound games, art projects, and interactive play that support vocabulary development, phonological awareness, and early reading. Activities are thoughtfully designed to be multisensory, allowing children to learn through movement, creativity, and imagination. |
| Art <i>in English</i> | 5-10 year olds | This art program introduces students to French art and culture through a guided sketchbook journal experience. Using art books, visual presentations, and museum references, students explore major Paris museums and artists while creating original artwork in their personal sketchbooks. |
| Spanish Art & Culture Camp | 3-5 year olds | Children explore the vibrant cultures of Spain, Mexico, and other Spanish-speaking countries through art, music, stories, hands-on projects, and fun cooking activities. Campers learn about traditions, symbols, and daily life while creating crafts, tasting flavors, and expressing their creativity in a lively, engaging environment. |
| French Art & Culture Camp | 3-5 year olds | Campers discover the culture of France and other French-speaking regions through art, design, storytelling, creative projects, and hands-on cooking experiences. Activities encourage creativity, curiosity, and a love for global culture, while tasting delicious treats inspired by each country. |
| Chinese Art & Culture Camp | 3-5 year olds | This camp introduces children to Chinese culture through calligraphy, traditional art, crafts, stories, festivals, and simple cooking experiences from China. Through creative projects and culinary activities, campers develop cultural awareness while |

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| Asian Art & Culture <i>in English</i> | 3-5 year olds and 6-10 year olds | Campers will travel through China, Japan, Korea, and Thailand to discover traditional and contemporary art forms such as calligraphy, painting, and design, while also learning about cultural symbols and festivals. Activities include art projects, music and movement, games, storytelling, and interactive discussions that bring each culture to life. |
| Spanish Literacy Camp | 5-10 year olds | While the younger children focus on phonetic sounds, word patterns, and "rhythms" of Spanish through music, songs, and games, older campers apply these foundations to reading and writing. They practice reading comprehension, expand their vocabulary, write stories, and engage in creative exercises that strengthen both their written and spoken Spanish skills. |
